From the Editor

"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity..."

We are just into 2021 and yet that famous opening line from Charles Dickens's A Tale of Two Cities has never rung truer. On the one hand, we are seeing the roll out of effective vaccines against a disease that little more than a year ago was unknown; a stunning tribute to human wisdom and on the other hand we have the incredible scenes of an enraged mob rampaging through the US Capitol, the centre of what was considered one of the most secure democracies on Earth.

Will wisdom or rage set our course for the coming months and years. It's too early to say, but what is clear is that the new covid-19 vaccines give us hope that some form of normality with return in 2021.

What is equally clear, is that if and when covid-19 is contained it won't be business as usual.

The pandemic has exposed the divisions, inequalities and structural weaknesses in societies around the world, not least in the established Western liberal democracies, such as the US and UK.

Meanwhile, problems such as climate change haven't gone away – 2020 was the joint hottest on record.

To see how best to move on, we would be wise to ask ourselves, how did we get here?

Social, economic and racial inequalities and the fostering of a "me first" culture leaves us ill equipped for the collaborative problem solving we need if we are to survive and thrive.

To continue with Dickens, hopefully, a spring of hope is to follow the winter of despair.

Regarding Lent

'I can resist everything but temptation' (Oscar Wilde).

During Lent we remember Jesus' experience in the wilderness (Matthew 4:1-11), when 'He was led by the Spirit.. to be tempted by the devil.' Temptation is a test of obedience, whether we do things our way or God's way. After 40 days of fasting Jesus was tired, hungry and vulnerable. Like Him, the Devil will attack us at our most vulnerable moments, especially during this pandemic.

The first temptation was to turn stones into bread: Jesus' ministry was not about meeting His own needs, but being nourished by God's word. 'We do not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God' (Deuteronomy 8:3). Like Jesus, we are called to make God our priority and trust Him completely.

The second temptation was to put God to the test: Jumping off the Temple pinnacle would have been a dramatic way for Jesus to gain popularity, but this is not God's way! 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.' (Deuteronomy 6:16). We too need to learn this lesson!

The third temptation was to worship Satan: Finally, the devil took Jesus to a mountain to offer Him worldly power. In contrast, His calling as Messiah was marked by suffering and honouring God. 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only' (Deuteronomy 6:13). This is often our experience in living for God.

Jesus stands with us in our temptations. As we claim the promises of Scripture, we will find strength in the power of the Spirit and the victory of the Cross.

Lenten Offerings

Lent is traditionally a time of sacrifice and self-discipline.

In keeping with this tradition we will be providing "Lenten Offering Envelopes" so that parishioners can, if they wish, make sacrificial offerings in addition to normal offerings. The funds will be used to seed our new Youth Service.

The World Day of Prayer 2021 host country is Vanuatu and the theme is "Build on a Strong Foundation".



Dear Friends

A number of people have made enquiries regarding offering support to those parishes directly affected by the fires.

The Parishes of Midland, Swan, Ellenbrook and Mundaring are those affected most directly. Many families and staff from Guildford Grammar School have also been personally affected. Should you or your family/parish wish to contribute for emergency relief it is possible to do so through the Anglican Community Fund (ACF). 
